## Charge While You Tow—

The Stay'NCharge System brings your batteries up to full charge while towing your boat down the road. A 12-volt start battery charges in about 22 minutes; three deep-cell 12-volt batteries set up as a 36-volt system (in series) charge to 98 percent in about two hours. The Original Stay'NCharge is designed to work with trolling motor batteries that are set up in parallel, while the Gorilla unit works with any batteries set up in series. **Dashboard Dilemma—**With a little ingenuity and good boat rigging, you can get all the electronics you need and quite a bit more mounted on the dash of your boat.
